#### **Child Safety**

#### **Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey**

At GWSPS we value suggestions and ideas for future planning and improvement and encourage all families to provide feedback to our school so that we can continue to provide an engaging learning environment and extra-curricular opportunities for our students.

Our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents think of our school. The Parent Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training. It is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of parents' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

All parents will have received an invitation via compass to participate in this year's survey. All responses to the survey are anonymous. This year the Parent Opinion Survey will be conducted from **Monday 29<sup>th</sup> July to Friday 30<sup>th</sup> August.** The survey will be conducted online, only takes 15-20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. The survey results will be reported back to the school at the end of September.

#### Swimming

The 2-week whole school swimming program is set to begin on Monday the 12<sup>th</sup> of August and will run until Friday the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August. Level 5/6 students will complete 10 days of the program, Monday-Friday both weeks. Students in Levels 1-4 will complete 8 days of the program, Monday-Thursday both weeks.

Swimming and water safety is a vital part of your child's education and is included in the Health and Physical Education curriculum from Foundation – Level 10. This requires schools to ensure that they are implementing a swimming and water safety program that meets the requirements of the curriculum.

We encourage all students to participate in this program. Please provide consent & payment on Compass by the due date. If you do not wish your child to participate in the swimming program, please contact your child's teacher directly via email to inform us.

#### **Foundation 100 Days of School**

Our Foundation students will reach their 100<sup>th</sup> day of school during Week 5 of this term! This milestone will be celebrated on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> of August, with students participating in a variety of activities based around the number '100'. Thank you to Mrs Lawrence for organising the activities on this special occasion!

We congratulate all our wonderful Foundation students and acknowledge the efforts of Mrs Lawrence, and our amazing staff who have supported and nurtured our students throughout this early part of their schooling, setting up a solid foundation for their ongoing learning and wellbeing.

#### Illnesses

#### Mathletics

We encourage all students to access their Mathletics account at home or at school. It is a great resource to help students practise their Maths skills in an interactive way using technology. If your child does not have access to the internet at home to use Mathletics, arrangements can be made with your child's teacher so they can access Mathletics at school.



Certificates are awarded automatically through the Mathletics system and are awarded fortnightly at Friday assemblies.




## Term 3 Family Library Activity

I look forward to seeing what your family will share with us! Your design might even be printed as a real bookmark!



- Monitoring the current trends in education and training that impact on all Koorie students.
- Providing an advocate role for Koorie students and their families with respect to education matters.
- Providing representation to local and regional committees and forums in relation to education and training. Providing representation to all VAEAI forums.
- Work in partnership with the Victorian Department of Education (DE) Koorie Education Workforce (such as KESOs) and many more Koorie Education stakeholders.
- Play a pivotal role in the implementation of the statewide Marrung Aboriginal Education Strategy.
- To connect and get to know other Koorie community members interested in education.


