NAPLAN - 12th-17th March

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) involves students in Years 3 and 5 from all states and territories in Australia. NAPLAN testing will take place from Wednesday 12th March, through to Monday 17th March. Students' skills in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, punctuation and grammar) and numeracy will be assessed. These national test results provide information on how your child is progressing and performing in the key areas of literacy and numeracy and also help to support improvements in teaching to benefit your child. Parents can support their children to be ready to participate in these assessment tasks by facilitating a smooth, calm start to each day. Please ensure that your child/ren have breakfast before coming to school and that they arrive to school on time.

Individual student NAPLAN reports will be forwarded to families later in the year. These reports will provide parents and staff with a snapshot of students' achievements but should not be seen as a definitive or comprehensive assessment. Thanks to Mrs Tineke Reincke for her organisation and coordination of the NAPLAN assessment and thank you to all staff involved in supervising.

Student Attendance - Every Day Counts

The following extract comes from the DET website: http://www.education.vic.gov.au/about/programs/health/Pages/studentattendance.asp. 'We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – **a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year. By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school.** There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Coming to school every day is vital, but if for any reason your child must miss school, there are steps you can take to ensure they don't fall behind:

• Speak with your classroom teacher or year level coordinator and find out what work your child needs to do to keep up.



• Develop an absence learning plan with your school and ensure your child completes the plan. Remember, everyday counts. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher or year level coordinator as early as possible.'

Maths Matters

Mathletics

We encourage all students to access their Mathletics account at home or at school. It is a great resource to help students practise their Maths skills in an interactive way using technology. If your child does not have access to the internet at home to use Mathletics, arrangements can be made with your child's teacher so they can access Mathletics at school.



Certificates are awarded automatically through the Mathletics system and are awarded fortnightly at Friday assemblies.

This year students will be awarded their first gold certificate of the year at assembly, after that they will be awarded their first Emerald and Legend certificates of the year at assembly. This is due to Mathletics changing how they award certificates compared to previous years.

Maths Olympiad

The Maths Olympiad is an engaging and challenging maths competition for senior primary school students run by the Australian Problem-Solving Mathematical Olympiad (APSMO). Interested students in Levels 5 and 6 are invited to participate in the trials to join a school team to participate in this competition.

The trials to select our school team will be held during the school day. The team members will be chosen based on the trial assessment results. The team will then meet weekly on Wednesdays at 1.40pm for 30 minutes, beginning on Wednesday 5th March, to complete preparation trials before each competition. It is anticipated these trials will be held during class time as part of the High Abilities program.

The team will be notified of the dates and times for each session.

- Contest 2: 11th June 2025
- Contest 3: 30th July 2025
- Contest 4: 10th September 2025

PLAY (Positivity, Leadership and Activated Youth) is a program designed to boost the resilience and wellbeing of young people. The program trains up to 30 Grade 5 and 6 student leaders to lead safe and fun activities with peers and younger students during breaks. Structured sessions promote confidence, relationship skills, inclusion and belonging. PLAY encourages physical activity, social skills and cooperation among students of all ages and abilities.

The PLAY program promotes:

- Increased social inclusion and connection
- Improved self-esteem and confidence
- Improved emotional wellbeing
- Increased resilience
- Improved leadership skills
- Increased school engagement
- Reduced antisocial behaviour

On Tuesday 18th February, 28 Level 5 and 6 PLAY leaders engaged in a whole day training session at school where they learnt how to play numerous co-operative games. They then had the opportunity to practise their leadership skills by running some of these games with the Foundation and Grade 1 students. Everyone had a wonderful day!

National Apology Day

February 13th marked the Anniversary of the National Apology to Australia's Indigenous Peoples. On 13 February 2008, then Prime Minister Kevin Rudd offered a formal apology to Australia's Indigenous peoples, particularly the Stolen Generations, on behalf of the nation at the Australian Parliament House.
